- Cultural assets for the nation










The System at NHK Archives

Digital HDTV

NHK's HDTV service

- Clear picture and compelling sound
 - -1,125 scanning lines and 5.1 surround audio
- 96% of broadcasts on our terrestrial channel produced and sent out in the HD format
- Adopted for the 2008 Beijing Olympics
- NHK-UNESCO world heritage video archive







Digital HDTV

Silk Road Project

- "Silk Road" documentary series (film roll)
- Historic piece co-produced with CCTV China
- Renovated and renewed in a HDTV format

HDTV technology

- HDTV draw out the details in the film
- Retouching the deteriorated and faded film
- Revived, surpassing the original visual standards









Doing away with the need for tapes

Tape-less format with HDTV

- The system without any tape
- Much more capacity and speedup of SDTV
- Economical

NHK Archives' challenge


- Whether to use servers for preservation or high-capacity optical disks
